### (3) Explanation of missed deadlines

In September 2012, the Department missed the following deadlines:

Deadline missed	Reason
Release first data on proportion of patients with greater control of their care records	This is a new data collection and has required the collation and validation of complex data. The initial collection identified issues with data quality and completeness which are now being addressed. Comprehensive data will now be available in November 2012 and thereafter on a quarterly basis.
Provide 6 month progress report to the Prime Minister on the Prime Minister's challenge on dementia	It has now been agreed for the report to be delivered and launched in late October.
Publish the first part of an indicator in the NHS Outcomes Framework and a definition for the second part	Data for the first part of the indicator was published on 25 September. We are working on a definition for the second part of the indicator and are due to publish an update of this work when the NHS Outcomes Framework is refreshed this autumn.
Report progress on the number of national organisations that have pledged to look at how they can play a part in creating a more dementia friendly society and raise awareness of dementia	The intention has always been for this information to be reported in the first report of progress to the Prime Minister. It is expected to be reported in the October progress report.

Complete the evaluation of NHS 111 pilot sites and informed by its findings, begin implementation in England as appropriate	Still not complete	Final preparations are being made by the University of Sheffield for publishing the evaluation in October.
Monitor information sharing and evaluate its impact	Still not complete	The Department of Health and Home Office have seen a draft report of the audit and Ministers have agreed to defer publication until there is more comprehensive national coverage. This will make the findings more robust and enable key areas to be targeted so that we can better deliver the Coalition Commitment. We will publish the final report in the autumn.
