

Horn of Africa – UK response to the crisis

The crisis is affecting 12.4 million people – more than the combined population of Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. We know the situation will get worse in places before it gets better, with rains unlikely before the autumn.

The UK Government is providing lifesaving emergency assistance for more than 2.6 million people in the Horn of Africa.

The £52.25 million package announced on 16 July will provide emergency assistance to:

- 500,000 people in Somalia
- 130,000 refugees in the Dadaab refugee camp in Kenya.
- 200,000 people in Kenya
- 100,000 people in the Dolo Ado refugee camps in Ethiopia

On 3 July, the UK Government announced support for 1.36 million people facing starvation in Ethiopia. The £38 million package will provide emergency nutrition to 329,000 malnourished children and pregnant and breastfeeding mothers.

In addition to the £90.25 million outlined above, the UK Government's contribution of £5.044 million from the UN's Central Emergency Response Fund, brings the UK Government's overall emergency response to the Horn of Africa to £95.29 million.

Ethiopia

£38 million support to provide **emergency food assistance to 1.36 million Ethiopians** for the next three months and supplementary food treatment for 329,000 children and pregnant and breastfeeding mothers.

£10 million package of support for **100,000 people in Dolo Ado refugee camps in Ethiopia** for the next four months, which will provide:

- Support for registering and receiving 57,600 refugees
- Treatment for severe acute malnutrition for 6,300 children and treatment for acute malnutrition for 21,600 children
- Shelter for 36,000 people
- Access to safe water for 100,000 people
- Blankets, jerry cans and basic cooking utensils for over 100,000 people

Horn of Africa – UK response to the crisis (continued)

Somalia

£25 million package of support to more than **500,000 victims of drought in Somalia** which will provide:

- Three months of basic food rations for nearly 20,000 people
- Treatment for over 60,000 malnourished children
- Access to safe water for 300,000 people
- Shelter for 45,000 people
- Agricultural supplies for 45,000 people to grow their own food
- Health care for 140,000 people
- More than 165,000 people provided with cash and/or food vouchers for food baskets for at least three months

Kenya

£6 million package for more than **130,000 refugees in the Dadaab camp in Kenya** which will provide:

- Nutritional support for 23,000 children and breastfeeding women
- Access to safe drinking water for 105,000 people
- Tents and cooking equipment to 3,500 families
- Healthcare for 153,000 people
- 15,000 kilos of emergency stock of ‘plumpy nut’, used to treat malnourished children

£11.25 million package of support for **200,000 people in Kenya** which will provide:

- Food rations provided to 115,400 malnourished children and breast feeding women
- Complementary feeding and nutritional supplements provided to 86,000 children and 129,000 pregnant women.
- Treatment of more than 90,000 malnourished children
