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A survey of disabled working age benefit claimants

This report presents findings from a survey of disabled people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance, Employment and Support Allowance or Incapacity Benefit. The research was conducted to investigate disabled working age benefit claimants' current circumstances, health conditions and attitudes towards work.

The fieldwork was conducted by Ipsos MORI using members of their established online survey panel. In total 1349 people completed the survey.

The key objectives of the survey were to gather information from disabled working age benefit claimants on:

- Their health condition and perception of their disability status;
- Support they were receiving to help find employment and current jobseeking activity;
- The barriers that they perceived to obtaining employment and the types of support that would be helpful to find work;
- Their attitudes towards work;
- Employment and benefit history; and
- Demographics.

Findings from the survey will be considered in the development of the disability employment strategy to be published later this year.

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Abbreviations and glossary

DLA Disability Living Allowance. Benefit providing a cash

contribution towards the extra costs of needs arising from an impairment or health condition. It is a tax free, non-means-tested and non-contributory benefit, and it is

payable regardless of employment status.

ESA Employment and Support Allowance. Benefit

introduced in October 2008 to replace Incapacity Benefit, Severe Disablement Allowance and Income Support paid on the grounds of illness or disability. It provides financial support and personalised help for people who are unable to work, because of a health condition.

ESA SG Employment and Support Allowance Support Group.

Category of ESA claimants who have been assessed as having limited capability for work with more severe functional limitations. Claimants in this group are not required to participate in activities to prepare them for a return to work, however they can so do on a voluntary

basis.

ESA WRAG Employment and Support Allowance Work Related

Activity Group. Category of ESA claimants who have been assessed as having a limited capacity for work and who require support to prepare for work in the future.

IB Incapacity Benefit. Benefit paid to people under state

pension age who cannot work because of an illness or

disability. Replaced by ESA from 2008.

JSA Jobseeker's Allowance. The main benefit for people of

working age who are out of work or work less than 16

hours a week on average.

1. Introduction

In May 2013 the Department for Work and Pensions commissioned Ipsos MORI to conduct a survey of disabled claimants of working age benefits to investigate their current circumstances, health conditions and attitudes towards work.

The survey was conducted to inform the development of a disability employment strategy to be published later this year.

This report was produced by the DWP research team.

2. Research Objectives

The key objectives of the survey were to gather information from disabled working age benefit claimants on:

- Their health condition and perception of their disability status;
- Support they were receiving to help find employment and current jobseeking activity;
- The barriers that they perceived to obtaining employment and the types of support that would be helpful to find work;
- Their attitudes towards work;
- Employment and benefit history; and
- Demographics.

3. Research design

The research was carried out through an online survey using members of Ipsos MORI's established online panel. A questionnaire consisting of 22 closed questions was prepared by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) with input and advice from Ipsos MORI. Ipsos MORI scripted the online questionnaire, tested the script and sent an invitation to take part in the survey to online panellists.

3.1 Timing of survey

The survey took place from 7th to 13th May 2013. Questionnaires were completed by 1349 online panellists who met the eligibility criteria for the survey (see section 3.2).

3.2 Sample composition

Invitations to take part in the survey were issued to members of the online panel who were classified¹ as:

- Unemployed; or
- Not working; or
- Having a long-lasting health problem, an illness or a disability.

The requirements to be included in the sample were:

- Individuals claiming Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) who met the Equality Act definition of disability²
- Individuals claiming Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Individuals claiming Incapacity Benefit (IB)

Screening questions were included at the start of the online interview and claimants who did not fall into any of the groups above were screened out of the survey. A copy of the questionnaire is included in Appendix A.

As the survey was conducted using an online panel it should be noted that there may be some structural differences to those individuals who are members of the online panel, compared to people in the wider population. To reduce this effect, the achieved sample was weighted to be representative of the population of disabled JSA, ESA and IB claimants.

² According to the Equality Act 2010 a person has a disability if they have a physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and long-standing adverse effect on their ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities. Long-term means that the effect of the impairment has lasted or is expected to last for 12 months or more.

3.3 Weighting

To ensure the findings from the survey were broadly representative of the make up of the wider population of disabled claimants on working age benefits, survey responses were weighted according to:

- Benefit type (JSA, IB and ESA), including ESA grouping (Work Related Activity Group, Support Group and Assessment phase)
- Age
- Gender

Breakdowns are included in Table 3.1 below.

3.4 Comparability with other surveys

The survey was designed as a snapshot data collection exercise to look at the circumstances and views of disabled people claiming ESA, JSA or IB. It was not designed to be directly comparable with other surveys of disabled benefit claimants, due to differences in the questionnaire and methodology. Therefore direct comparisons of results should not be made with other surveys of disabled people.

3.5 Survey sample demographics

The survey sample demographics are included in Table 3.1.

4. Key Findings

The key findings from the survey are reported below. Full breakdowns of survey responses by benefit type, perceptions of disability, age and qualifications are included in Section 5.

4.1 Health conditions

- Overall claimants were most likely to report having mobility impairments (62%) or mental health conditions (49%) and least likely to report having hearing or vision impairments (both 8%).
- The most prevalent impairment among Incapacity Benefit (IB), Employment and Support Allowance Support Group (ESA SG) and Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) was related to mobility (for 76%, 67% and 48% of claimants respectively). Among ESA Work Related Activity (WRAG) and assessment groups mental health conditions were the most prevalent type of impairment (57% each).
- Claimants aged over 55 were twice as likely to have a mobility impairment as those aged 18–34.

4.2 Perceptions of disability status

- Claimants were asked whether they considered themselves to be disabled or not. Half did consider themselves to be disabled, including the majority of those with a mobility impairment (66%).
- Typically those who considered themselves to be disabled were more likely to report having any condition than those who did not consider themselves disabled, or who only considered themselves disabled some of the time.
- Older claimants were far more likely to consider themselves disabled than younger claimants - 62 per cent of over 55s considered themselves disabled compared to 32 per cent of those aged 18–34.
- Half of claimants were also receiving Disability Living Allowance (DLA) in addition to their JSA/ESA or IB, with receipt differing by age and benefit. Thirty-nine per cent of the 18-34 age group received DLA, increasing to 60 per cent of those 55 plus. Meanwhile around a quarter of JSA claimants were receiving DLA (24%) compared to almost seven in ten IB claimants (69%).

4.3 Beliefs about work

- The majority of claimants agreed that they wanted to work (56%) and that having a job would make them better off financially (65%).
 - JSA claimants were most likely to agree that they wanted to work (84%); however this was also the case for over half of ESA claimants.
- However claimants were significantly less likely to agree they were currently able to work (15%) or that having a job would be beneficial for their health (23%):
 - JSA claimants were most likely to agree that they were currently able to work (68%). For all other benefit groups this view was held by 15 per cent or less.
 - Less than half of claimants from all benefit groups thought having a
 job would be beneficial to their health.
- Overall attitudes and beliefs regarding work for ESA WRAG claimants were more similar to other ESA/IB claimants than those claiming JSA.

4.4 Barriers to work and work enablers

- The most commonly reported barriers to work were a lack of job opportunities (mentioned by 36% of claimants overall, including 62% of JSA claimants and 43% of ESA WRAG claimants), difficulty with transport (mentioned by 31%, including 42% of JSA claimants) and attitudes of employers 30% (JSA 40%, ESA WRAG 35%). For those claimants currently seeking work the most commonly reported barriers were a lack of job opportunities (60%), attitudes of employers (42%), lack of qualifications/experience/skills (41%) and difficulty with transport (37%).
- ESA SG (27%) and IB (30%) claimants were more likely to cite difficulties using facilities or equipment than other groups. Whilst 18-34 year olds were more likely to cite a lack of confidence / motivation as a barrier (38%) compared to those 55 plus (22%).
- A third of claimants reported 'other' barriers to work. This is likely to include barriers regarding their health condition.
- The most commonly cited enablers to help claimants look for and find work across benefit groups were more employer incentives (39%), more support to manage their health condition (39%), specialist support to help disabled people/ those with health conditions find work (38%) and modified hours/days/duties (38%).

- Those who considered themselves disabled were also most likely to cite
 the above enablers however they were more likely to cite support to
 manage their health condition and specialist support to help disabled
 people find work than those who didn't consider themselves disabled.
- Around a quarter (25%) thought none of the listed enablers would help them into work – including over a third of IB and ESA SG claimants, and those with no qualifications.

4.5 Job-seeking behaviour

- Overall, less than a quarter (22%) of claimants were currently actively seeking work. Those on JSA were by far the most likely group to be looking for work (89%) followed by ESA WRAG (30%).
- There were also differences in job-seeking by age and perceptions of disability status. As age increased, job-seeking dropped around a third of 18–34 year olds were seeking work compared to 11 per cent of those 55 plus. Eighty-six per cent of those who considered themselves disabled were not seeking work, falling to just over half (56%) for those who did not consider themselves disabled.
- Of those looking for work, jobsearch activity was significantly higher for JSA claimants than ESA WRAG:
 - They had applied for more jobs: 39 per cent of JSA claimants had applied for over ten jobs in the last month; 53 per cent of ESA WRAG claimants had applied for two or fewer jobs.
 - They had spent more time looking for work: half of JSA claimants had spent 4 days or more looking for work in the last week (50%) compared to 30 per cent of ESA WRAG claimants that spent less than half a day in the last week looking.
- Expectations of finding work were also related to benefit claimed, perceptions of disability status and age. 69 per cent of all JSA claimants expected to find work within a year, compared to 29 per cent of the ESA WRAG, 11 per cent of ESA SG claimants and 8 per cent of those on IB. Sixty-four per cent of those who considered themselves disabled, and just over three-quarters of over 55s never expect to find a job (76%).

4.6 Experience of employment support

 A minority of claimants were receiving support to find work (12% via Jobcentre Plus; 12% via the Work Programme and 1% via Work Choice). Among claimants who were receiving support, over half did not find this useful (60%). Around a half of the claimants accessing support felt under 'a lot' of pressure from Jobcentre Plus or their employment advisor to look for work (52%).

- Accessing support differed by age and benefit type. The 18-34 year olds were more than three times as likely (45%) as over 55s to be receiving support (14%). IB claimants were most likely to not be receiving support (91% compared to 13% of JSA claimants).
- Over a quarter of those 'currently seeking work' were not accessing support via Jobcentre Plus or an employment programme (28%).

4.7 Work and benefit history

- Overall few claimants had a recent history of paid work. Over a third of claimants were last in paid work over ten years ago (34%), with the rate increasing to a half of IB claimants.
- Four per cent of claimants had never been in paid employment.
- JSA claimants and those in the ESA assessment group were most likely to have a recent work history, with 17 per cent and 15 per cent of them respectively having been in paid work in the past year.
- Almost two in five claimants had been claiming their current benefit for over five years (37%), including over three quarters of IB claimants (76%).
