Further to your request for information under the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 2000, dated 19th August 2013, which sought:

a breakdown of households in the north of Scotland eligible for the Hydro Benefit Replacement Scheme. I'm particularly interested in the number of homes in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire and Moray and the value of savings for homes in those areas.

I am writing to advise you that DECC does not hold information on the breakdown of households by area in the North of Scotland benefitting from the Hydro Benefit Replacement Scheme. The closest information we hold to this is the number of domestic electricity meter points by local authority area, and this provides a broad approximation. However, it should be noted that the number of meters does not exactly equal the number of properties, for example because some households may have a 3-rate meter system with one meter which measures all consumption at a peak rate and another meter which measures two other rates of off-peak consumption. The data is published in the *Regional and Local Authority Electricity Consumption Statistics: 2005 to 2011*. Alternatively, the General Register Office for Scotland publishes an estimate of the number of households and dwellings in Scotland by local authority area, although this will not equate exactly to numbers of domestic electricity customers. The publication is available at:

The Hydro Benefit Replacement Scheme works by lowering the total cost of supplying electricity in the North of Scotland, and is not applied directly as an individual household discount. However, it is estimated that in 2011/12, the assistance amount provided to the 690,000 domestic customers in the North of Scotland was equivalent to an average bill reduction of £36 per year. Government's decision to retain the scheme means these customers, and non-domestic customers in this region, will continue to benefit from reduced bills.
