**AGREEMENT ON AN AMENDMENT OF THE AGREEMENT SIGNED
ON 9 SEPTEMBER 1977 BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE
UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND
AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TURKEY
CONCERNING INTERNATIONAL ROAD TRANSPORT**

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Turkey agreed to make the following amendments to the International Road Transport Agreement:

ARTICLE 1

Article 7 of the Agreement is amended as follows:

- (a) Vehicles or the combinations of vehicles referred to in Article 2 (b) ii, registered in the territory of one of the Parties and used for the transport of goods between the territories of the Parties shall not require a permit and shall not be subject to a quota system for entry and exit.
- (b) Vehicles or the combinations of vehicles referred to in Article 2 (b) ii, registered in the territory of one of the Parties and used for transit transport across the territory of the other Party shall not require a permit and shall not be subject to a quota system.

Article 9 of the Agreement is amended as follows:

- (a) A transport operation between the territory of one Party and the territory of a third country or between the territory of a third country and that of other party by a vehicle registered in one of the Parties shall require a permit and shall be subject to a quota system.
- (b) The number of permits to be exchanged shall be fixed by the Joint Committee provided for by Article 19 of this Agreement or by exchange of correspondences between the competent authorities of the Parties.

Article 10 of the Agreement is amended as follows:

Vehicles registered in one of the Parties having carried goods to the other Party or the entry of an unladen vehicle registered in one of the Parties to the territory of the other Party in order to load goods intended for the country of registration shall not require a permit.

ARTICLE 2

This Agreement shall come into force on the date when Parties notify each other that the Constitutional formalities for coming into effect are completed.

Done in Ankara on 20 May 2009 in English and Turkish language both texts are equally authentic.
