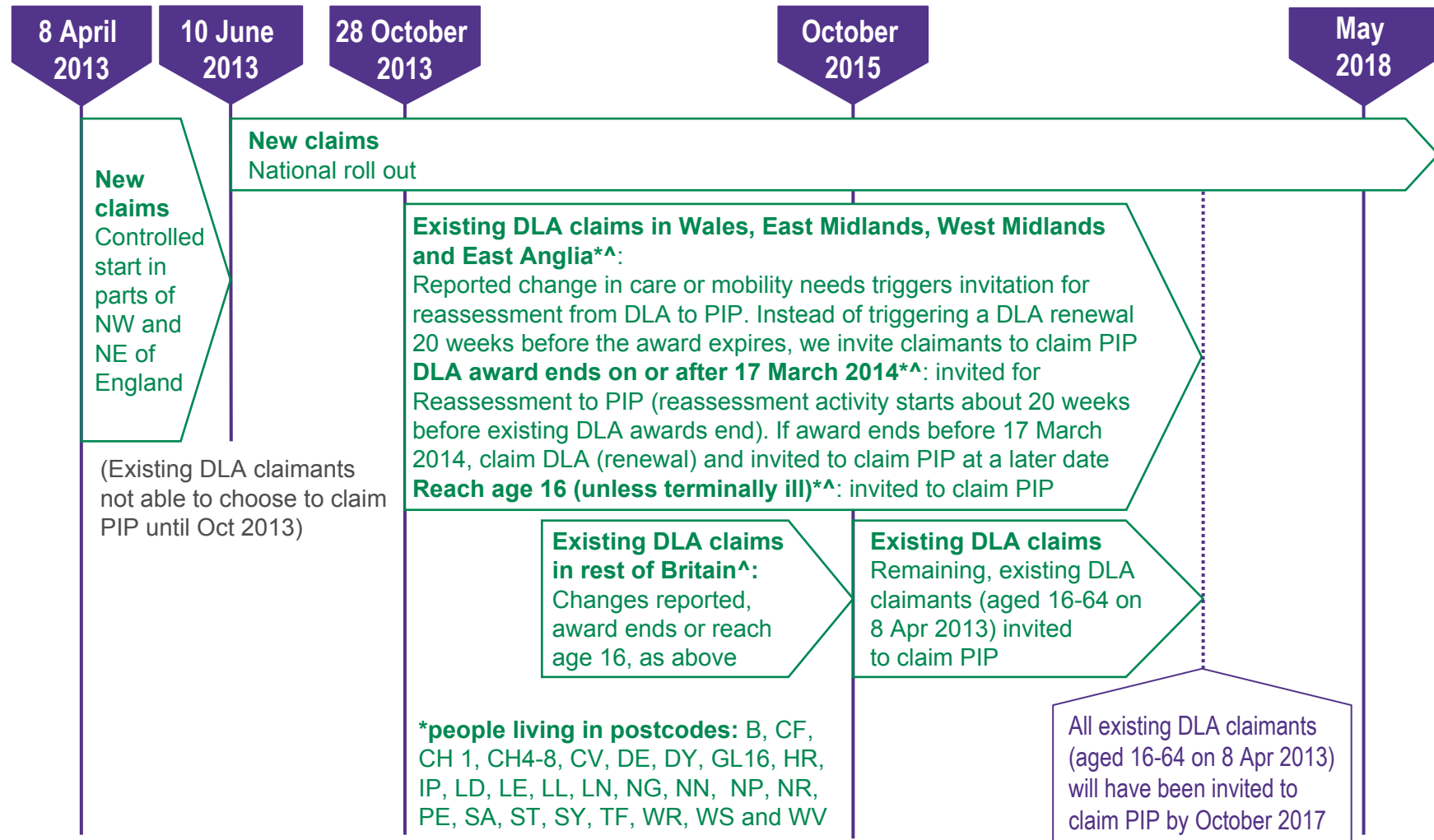

*DWP will invite existing DLA claimants who live in the following postcodes to claim PIP: B, CF, CH 1, CH4, CH5, CH6, CH7, CH8, CV, DE, DY, GL16, HR, IP, LD, LE, LL, LN, NG, NN, NP, NR, PE, SA, ST, SY, TF, WR, WS and WV.
