



859 HSAs carried out by **170** firefighters, **30** community safety staff and **106** volunteers, support staff and members, together with **16** partners



Fire service staff on a mission to make winter safer for OAPs

Eight-hundred-and-fifty-nine residents are set for a safer winter thanks to the third annual Cheshire Safety Day.

Last year, 3,400 people died in the North West alone owing to the effects of the cold weather.

For that reason, Cheshire Fire and Rescue Services' annual safety day on 29th November was entitled *Get Set for Winter* and hundreds of members of staff went out into the community in a bid to make Cheshire safer.

Their mission was to help older people during the cold weather period and raise awareness of the importance of smoke alarms. They also focused on cooking and electrical safety.

The vulnerable households aged over 65 were visited across Cheshire, Halton and Warrington. Every resident was given a safety information bag, which included a scarf and an Age UK guide to keeping well, a Shoving Worn / A Winter booklet and a thermometer to monitor room temperature.

Cheshire Fire Authority chairman Councillor John Joyce took part in delivering home safety assessments during the day.

He said: "It was a fantastic success and one that saw us directly engaging with hundreds of older people in their homes."

It has been an honour and a real pleasure to take part in such an exciting initiative. Cheshire Fire and Rescue Services' community safety work and the impact it is having on saving lives is truly inspirational."

Paul Hancock, Cheshire Fire Officer, said: "The whole service pulled together on this day to complete 850 home safety assessments and this shows our commitment to reducing the number of fires in the home."

He thanked people who "took the time to talk to us and let us into their homes."


