
Why we are setting up a Settlement Body

- Capacity Market requires payments to flow between suppliers and capacity providers
- These payments are likely to be classified as a tax and a public body must be responsible and accountable for collecting the tax
- A new Government company, set up to mirror the CfD counterparty as much as is legally and practically possible is the most efficient option
- It must be legally separate from CfD counterparty to isolate the payment flows of the two bodies


Payment Flows - Summary

Timeline

September/ Oct 2014	Bid bonds & collateral for CM auction (possible role for CMSB)
Summer 2015	Bid bonds and collateral for CM auction & DSR transitional auction to be held by CMSB
October 2016	First DSR transitional payments start
October 2018	Full payments begin
