It was noted that during the time that the camel & ankoli are kept in the "holding" tent next to the ring, water is not constantly available. This, according to the daily records, may be 4.5 hours. This would appear to be in breach of 4(c) of the Guidance.

According to the management buckets of water would be knocked over & so water is offered regularly but this is only recorded if a bucket is drunk ("B" on daily records).

Water should be available continuously, but if this is not the case then, at the very least, water should be offered regularly (eg. every hour) & this, as well as consumption, should be recorded.

Routine inspection under the Welfare of Wild Animals in Travelling Circuses (England) Regulations 2012

As you know, an unannounced inspection of your travelling circus took place on 27 June 2013 under the Welfare of Wild Animals in Travelling Circuses (England) Regulations 2012 (the Regulations).

The inspector's findings have been considered by a panel of officials on behalf of the Secretary of State, who were satisfied that at the time of the visit the conditions of the Regulations appeared to be being complied with and who have recommended that your current licence is allowed to continue.

While the inspector was satisfied that all the Licensing Conditions are being met by your circus, a number of points were noted which you should consider now, with input from your Lead Vet as required:

1. The inspector noted that during the time that the Camel and Ankoli are kept in the "holding" tent next to the ring, water was not constantly available. You are reminded that the Guidance on the Regulations states that "Fresh, clean drinking water of sufficient quantity must be available at all times" (Section 4 Diet, paragraph 4C). The inspector has recommended that water should be continuously available, but if this is not practical then, at the very least, water should be offered regularly (e.g, every hour) and this, as well as consumption, should be recorded.
2. The inspector noted that your reindeer will require a hoof trim shortly, especially of the accessory digits.

3. The inspector noted that a panacur worming treatment for the Ankole and Camel had been entered on the appropriate daily sheet but information on the treatment had not been transferred to the appropriate individual records. You are reminded that all treatments should be duplicated in the animal's individual record.
4. The inspector noted that some positive aspects were not always recorded in the animal's Daily Records. In particular, when the racoon was taken for a walk it was not always recorded. The inspector recommended that such positive aspects be recorded.

The Panel also noted that updates of your tour itinerary continue to be submitted on an intermittent basis, sometimes where the previous update has only a few days left before the list of venues run out. You are reminded that your tour itinerary should be provided to AHVLA SSC with as much notice as possible.

Further Inspections

We made clear to you when issuing your licence that there would be at least two additional inspections during the year. The inspection on the 27 June 2013 represented one of these inspections. There will be at least one further announced inspection. The Secretary of State also retains the power to undertake further announced or unannounced inspections during the remaining period of your licence. Additional inspections may also be required in response to changes in your stock list, any complaints received or concerns raised about the wild animals in your circus.

You will usually be charged for the costs of any further inspection visits, once they have taken place.
