ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and of Her other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these Presents shall come:

GREETING!

WHEREAS WE have taken into Our Royal consideration the long campaign service rendered by members of Our Armed Forces since the fourteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and sixty nine in those operations for which the award of the General Service Medal, 1962 is deemed to be appropriate.

AND whereas We are desirous of recognising such long campaign service; We do by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors institute and create a new Medal.

Firstly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Accumulated Campaign Service Medal".

Secondly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be circular in form and in silver, that it shall bear on the obverse the Crowned Effigy of the Sovereign and on the reverse the inscription "FOR ACCUMULATED CAMPAIGN SERVICE" set within a four part ribbon surrounded by a branch of oak leaves with laurel and olive leaves woven through the motto ribbon.

Thirdly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn by recipients on the left breast on a ribbon one-and-a-quarter inches in width in purple and green with a stripe of gold to denote excellence.

It is further ordained that in the official list showing the order in which Orders, Decorations and Medals should be worn it shall be placed immediately after the Medal for Meritorious Service.

Fourthly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded to holders of the General Service Medal, 1962 on completion of thirty six months accumulated campaign service since the fourteenth day of August, one

thousand nine hundred and sixty nine, as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned.

It is further ordained that any holder of the Accumulated Campaign Service Medal shall be awarded a Clasp for each further period of thirty six months accumulated campaign service as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned. A rose Emblem denoting the award of a Clasp shall be worn on the ribbon when the ribbon only is worn. Silver Emblems will be worn for the first three Clasps, a silver gilt Emblem will denote the fourth Clasp and a silver gilt and two silver Emblems for any further Clasp.

It is further ordained that the Medal shall be awarded to holders of the General Service Medal, 1962 who are part-time members of the Royal Irish Regiment on completion of one thousand days of qualifying service as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned and that Clasps to the Medal shall be awarded for each further period of one thousand days of qualifying service.

Fifthly: It is ordained that such service as may be defined from time to time in the regulations hereinafter mentioned shall reckon as qualifying service and that service not so defined shall not be reckonable.

Sixthly: It is ordained that reproductions of the Medal and Clasps, known as a Miniature Medal, which may be worn on certain occasions by those to whom the Medal is awarded, shall be half the size of Medal and Clasp respectively and that a sealed pattern of the said miniature shall be kept in the Central Chancery of Our Orders of Knighthood.

Seventhly: It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters in amplification of these Our rules and ordinances as may with Our approval, signified through one of Our Principal Secretaries, be issued from time to time by Our Defence Council.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

Given at Our Court of St James's this twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ninety four, in the forty second year of Our Reign.
