Completed visa application form: In some locations you can only apply by making an online application. You should check on our <u>supported</u> <u>countries page</u> to see if you should make an online application	<ul> <li>If your country does not support online applications you must complete and submit application form <u>VAR9</u> and <u>Appendix 5</u></li> <li>If you make an <u>online application</u> you must also print it off and submit with your supporting documents</li> </ul>	
A current and valid travel document or passport	You will not be issued a visa if you do not have one of these	
One passport-sized colour photograph	This must comply with the requirements in our photo guidance	
Evidence of your permission to be in the country where you are applying, if you are not a national of that country	This must show your current immigration status. It could be a residence permit, 'green card' or valid visa.	
Previous passports	These are to show your previous travel history	
Translations: The original translation must contain confirmation of the following from the translator:	<ul> <li>That it is an accurate translation of the original document</li> <li>The date of the translation</li> <li>The translators full name and signature</li> <li>The translators contact details</li> </ul>	
Tuberculosis screening	If you are a person from a country listed in <u>Appendix T</u> Part 1 making an application for entry clearance to come to the UK for more than six months, you must present, at the time of application, a valid medical certificate issued by a medical practitioner listed in Appendix T Part 2 confirming that you have undergone screening for active pulmonary tuberculosis and that this tuberculosis is not present.

## Sponsor

Tier 2 (General) is for people coming to the UK with a job offer to fill a gap that cannot be filled from within the resident labour force. It is also for applicants coming to fill shortage occupations.

	The Certificate of Sponsorship will act as an assurance that you are able to undertake a particular job and intend to do so. Your sponsorship is confirmed in your Certificate of Sponsorship. You must give your reference number when you apply.
<ul><li> a sponsor; and</li><li> a valid certificate of sponsorship</li></ul>	You will then be able to enter the United Kingdom for up to 14 days before the start date for the job shown on your Certificate of Sponsorship.

### Salary and allowances

Confirmation that you will be paid an appropriate salary and allowances for the job that you will be doing in the UK	You should ask your sponsor to confirm, on your certificate of sponsorship, the salary and allowances for the job. Limit on Tier 2 (General) workers applying from abroad For the year from 6 April 2014 to 6 April 2015, a maximum of 20,700 skilled workers can
	come to the UK under Tier 2 (General) to do jobs with an annual salary below £153,500.
	There is no limit on the number of workers coming to the UK to do jobs with an annual salary of £153,500 or above.

## English language ability

Proof of your English language skills you must send to support your application.	If you are a national of a majority English speaking country (as specified in the Immigration Rules), you can meet the requirement by sending your current original passport or travel document. You can also meet the requirement by providing documentary evidence that you have passed an English language test with an approved provider at or above level B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). The test and provider must be on our list of approved <u>English language test providers</u> . This evidence should contain your test results - for example, an original academic certificate of award for IELTS. If you have a degree completed in English or undertaken in a country where English is the main language, you can meet the requirement by providing your original academic certificate of award. If your degree was not taught in a majority English speaking country and is not listed on our points calculator, you must provide:
	<ul> <li>an original letter and/or certificate from UK NARIC confirming the equivalent level of your degree course; and</li> </ul>
	a letter from the academic institution that awarded the qualification.

## Maintenance in the UK

If your A-rated sponsor does not confirm this maintenance and accommodation, you must provide documents showing that you have had at least £945 in your account at all times over the 90 days period before you apply to us. Acceptable forms of evidence are shown on the next page.

Personal Bank Statements and /or a Savings Account pass book(s) and /or a letter from bank confirming level of funds on the bank's original letter headed paper.	These documents should cover a period of 90 days immediately preceding, and dated no more than 31 days prior to, the date you submit the application. The balance should not fall below the required minimum of £945 at any time during the 90 day period. Property, shares, bonds, pension funds, life insurance or similar savings accounts are not acceptable.
Letter from financial institution regulated by either the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) or the home regulator confirming funds	<ul> <li>The letter should state:</li> <li>your name;</li> <li>the account number;</li> <li>the date of the letter;</li> <li>the financial institution's name and logo</li> <li>the funds held in your account; and</li> <li>that the funds have been in the bank for at least 90 days.</li> <li>We will not accept letters which simply show the balance in the account on a particular day as these documents do not show that you hold enough funds for the full period required.</li> <li>The home regulator is the official regulatory body for the country in which the institution operates and the funds are located.</li> </ul>

## Dependants

Visa application form	Dependants must complete application form <u>VAF10</u> or an online form (if applicable).
Information about you	Dependants must also provide a current and valid travel document or passport, one passport sized colour photograph, evidence of their permission to be in the country where the application is made (if not a national of that country), previous passports and translations of any documents submitted that are not in English or Welsh.
Evidence of relationship to sponsor.	For example, marriage certificate, civil partnership registration or birth certificate.
Evidence of sponsor's permission to enter or stay in the UK.	Copy of the pages of sponsor's passport showing their visa if issued or permission to stay if already in the UK. If you are a child, you should provide evidence of both your parent's status in the UK to show that they are lawfully present in the UK, or being granted entry clearance or leave to remain at the same time as you – please see <u>paragraph 319 H (f) of the Immigration Rules</u> for details of this requirement
Evidence of maintenance.	If the Tier 2 migrant is employed by an A-rated sponsor who will maintain and accommodate them and any dependents until the end of their first month of employment in the UK, you must send a letter from the sponsor which confirms this. Otherwise, you must provide financial evidence showing adequate support for dependants. This must show additional funds of £630 per dependant in the account for at least 90 days immediately before the application.
