Programme delivering results

Mercian Ability Partnership (MAP) runs Shopmobility on behalf of Tamworth Borough Council.

Financial support from the Office for Disability Issues "Strengthening DPULOs Programme", in addition to some other funding, has enabled MAP to purchase ten mobility scooters, six manual wheelchairs and three rollators, all of which are now in service at Shopmobility Tamworth, based in Ankerside car park.

Shopmobility's equipment can be hired by anyone who has difficulty walking, either due to a disability, a temporary injury, or illness. You do not have to have a blue badge to use the service, and likewise, you do not need to be registered disabled, all MAP ask to see is photo ID and proof of address when you first join.

DPULO's Using Technology

The Hao2 Foundation with the working name 'Autus' is a DPLUO using online 3D digital technologies to provide both life skills and employment skills training to young people with complex needs, particularly those with Autism and Asperger's.

Training participants use 3D learning environments to navigate and communicate using avatars (digital versions of themselves) supported by a learning supervisor. These environments are designed to represent places found in the real world such as a classroom, office, supermarket amongst others.

Three evolutionary courses are available, starting from life skills, through work preparation to employability and personal development. This course comes with a City and Guilds qualification. The Foundation has recently secured funding to research and

develop peer-to-peer job collectives – see <http://www.autus.org.uk/projects>

The Foundation's 3D work and learning platform means that people with confidence issues are more willing and able to participate by being able to access the courses from a place they feel 'safe' and in a way that makes them feel empowered and supported.

The government recently published Think Autism, a new strategy for improving the lives of adults with autism in England. The strategy includes the 'Autism Innovation Fund', £4.5 million available throughout 2014/15 to support delivery of some of the government's key priorities. The Think Autism strategy includes the funding of organisations putting forward proposals from July that enable people with Autism to gain and grow skills for independence and employment. Proposals should demonstrate the core characteristics of: Innovation, including either technology or innovative service design or provision Partnership: an integrated approach to local services and/or partnership with local businesses, employers or other services

Autus, with its innovative technology and services, are well placed to apply for funding meeting these criteria and would like to hear from other DPLUOs wishing to explore a potential partnership.
