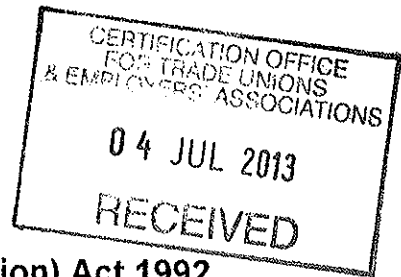



Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation of Accounts

Going concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The directors have assessed the Company's ability to continue as a going concern and have reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing these accounts.

Investments at cost

Investments are shown in the accounts at cost. Any funds at the Association not required for immediate disbursement shall be invested in such a way as the Committee may decide.

Income and expenditure

Investment income and bank interest are included in revenue on the date on which they are receivable.





INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF SNIPEF - GLASGOW & WEST OF SCOTLAND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TRADE UNION AND LABOUR RELATIONS (CONSOLIDATION) ACT 1992

We have audited the accounts of the SNIPEF – Glasgow & West of Scotland for the year ended 31 December 2012 which comprise the General Fund Balance Sheet, the General Fund Income and Expenditure Account, the Benevolent Fund Balance Sheet, the Benevolent Fund Income and Expenditure Account and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

This report is made solely to the Members of the Association, as a body, in accordance with the constitution and the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Members of the Association those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Members of the Association as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of Committee and auditor

The Committee of the Association's responsibilities for preparation of the accounts, which give a true and fair view, in accordance with the Constitution of the Association, applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) are set out in the Statement of Committee's Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the accounts in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the accounts

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the accounts sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Association's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the Committee; and the overall presentation of the accounts. In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the Committee's Report to identify material inconsistencies with the audited accounts. If we become aware of any apparent material misstatements or inconsistencies we consider the implications for our report.

Opinion

In our opinion:

- the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of the Association's affairs as at 31 December 2012 and of its deficit for the year then ended;
- the accounts have been prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and
