### Vaccine supply

#### Influenza vaccine supply for the children's part of the national flu vaccination programme

##### Availability of Fluenz Tetra

From Monday 6 October, the temporary order limit for Fluenz Tetra will be lifted for English customers.

Deliveries of Fluenz Tetra are being made weekly alongside your usual deliveries for childhood vaccines, and there is no need for practices to over order or stockpile vaccine unnecessarily. We suggest only ordering enough stock to cover the next one or two weeks to minimise wastage. The vaccine will be available throughout the entire flu season to ensure there is in-date stock available into the new year.

## Vaccines available

PHE has centrally procured flu vaccine for those children who are included in this year's phase of the programme and those children aged from six months to less than 18 years old in clinical risk groups.

The following vaccines will be available for the 2014 influenza season for children. The vaccines will be available on the ImmForm website during September as shown below.

Ordering of vaccines is expected to start on the dates set out below:

### Older eligible patients of the flu programme

Apart from this central procurement of vaccine for children less than 18 years of age, it remains the responsibility of general practices to order sufficient flu vaccine for older eligible patients of the flu programme in 2014/15 directly from manufacturers.
