A [new agreement](#) has been reached by UN members to tackle climate change at the COP 20 talks in Lima, Peru.

First Capacity Market auction open



The first Capacity Market auction is now underway. The auction is the next stage in the Government's plan to ensure the lights stay on at the least cost – both now and in the future.

The Capacity Market aims to ensure there is enough capacity available to meet peak electricity demand in the future. Electricity providers can bid into this capacity auction, promising if they win a contract that they will be available to provide electricity when needed. In return they receive a steady payment on top of the electricity that they sell.

The latest the auction could finish is the last auction round on Friday 19 December 2014. The full list of those who have pre-qualified to take part in the auction is on the [Capacity Market Register](#).

Energy efficiency measures top 1 million under Government schemes

A million home improvement measures will keep Britain's homes warmer for less this Christmas thanks to the [Government's energy efficiency schemes](#).



In under two years the Energy Company Obligation (ECO) and Green Deal package has delivered new boilers, windows and insulation to around 830,000 extra houses, bringing warmer homes and lower bills in time for Christmas.

Many homes were poorly-insulated and damp, costing over the odds to heat, while a substantial part of the work under ECO helped people living at risk of fuel poverty.

With additional Green Deal funding to be released in February and energy suppliers still delivering measures to meet their ECO targets by March, even more homes will receive help in the New Year.

A second release of the Green Deal Home Improvement Fund remains open, with up to £6 million still available to make energy efficient home improvements

from a selection of two measures. The funding for solid wall insulation has been fully allocated. Find out more about funding available and how to [apply here](#).
