Thank you for your email of 18 July 2015 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

- British Ambassador in Tunisia and the CEO of "Entreprise Tunisienne des Activités Pétrolières" (ETAP) on March 13th, 2006.
- British Ambassador in Tunisia and the Tunisian General Director of Energy Mr. Rassaa on May 18th, 2006.
- British Ambassador in Tunisia and the Tunisian Ministry of Industry Mr. Chelbi on July 11th, 2006.
- British Ambassador in Tunisia and the CEO of "Entreprise Tunisienne des Activités Pétrolières" (ETAP) on September 13th, 2006.
- British Ambassador in Tunisia and Mr Ben Arfa from "Société Tunisienne d'Electricité et de Gaz" (STEG) on October 16th, 2006.
- British Ambassador in Tunisia and the Tunisian General Director of Energy Mr. Rassaa on November 22nd, 2006.”

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.
