**OUTSIDE APPOINTMENTS**

I am pleased to tell you that the Foreign Secretary has approved your applications for permission to take on two unpaid outside appointments as: Visiting Professor in the policy institute in the faculty of Social Science and Public Policy at King's College London; and Honorary Fellow at the Judge Business School, University of Cambridge subject to the following conditions:

- For two years from your last day of service you should not become personally involved in lobbying UK Government on behalf of your new employers. Lobbying in this context means that you should not engage in communication with Government (including Ministers, special advisers and officials) with a view to influencing a Government decision or policy in relation to your own interests, or the interests of the organisation by which you are employed, or to whom you are contracted. Please note that this does not preclude routine contact; and
- Not to draw on privileged information available to you as a Civil Servant.
