

NOTICE OF ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 119

Herefordshire County Council
Footpath BQ4 (Part) Bolstone Public Path Diversion Order 2013

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 16 September 2015.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that length of Footpath BQ4 (Part) in the Parish of Bolstone which commences at County Road C1266 at OS Grid Reference SO 5462, 3268 (point A on the order plan) and travels in a generally north-north-easterly direction for approximately 172 metres through a paddock adjacent to Glenside to OS Grid Reference SO 5465, 3285 where it crosses a fence into a small paddock and continues in a generally north-north-westerly direction for approximately 22 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 5464, 3287 where it crosses a bridge and into a field then continues in a generally north-north-easterly direction for approximately 271 metres to join a track at OS Grid Reference SO 5477, 3311 (point B on the order plan). The total length of the existing said footpath is approximately 465 metres.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments

Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 30 September 2015]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the

Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 11 November 2015]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 23 December 2015]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order(s) must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
