3 new tenders in the Egyptian renewable energy sector

The Egyptian Electricity Transmission Company (EETC) and the New and Renewable Energy Authority (NREA) announced on 11 August 2015 three new tenders for the development of a total of 500MW wind and solar capacity on a Build, Own and Operate (BOO) basis in the West Nile Area with the participation of the private sector. Experienced local and foreign developers are invited to bid for these projects, where the produced electricity will be purchased by EETC on the basis of a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) to be signed with the developers. The land for the projects will be made available by NREA on a usufruct basis for the duration of the projects.
