

School teachers earning £65,000 or more in state funded schools in England

The latest statistics on the salaries received by teachers were published in July 2015 in Table 8 of the 'School Workforce in England: November 2014' statistical first release.

The statistics show there were 12,845 full and part-time teachers¹ earning a gross full-time equivalent annual salary (including any additional allowances) of £65,000 or more in November 2014. The following table provides a breakdown of those teachers earning £65,000 or more by their grade and by which school type within phase they are working in.
