Thank you for your email of 27th November 2015 following my response to FOI2015/09587 requesting the following information:

Can you please tell me how much is spent by the MoD on cars with police markings with the MoD Police, Royal Military police, RAF Police and Navy equivalent in financial year 2014-2015.

You have requested the following further information:

As a supplementary can you split the sum and give me the details for MoD Police, RMP, RAF P&SS and the Navy equivalent as separate sums.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

I can confirm that the spend on Ministry of Defence (MOD) cars with police markings during financial year 2014-15 was £1,188,113.00 (ex VAT). The break down is as follows:

Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
