These statistical tables have been revised on 25 February 2016 due to additional records being found within other sources of Field Hospital data now available. Previously the data presented was from J97 Field Hospital returns only and now the numbers include records from OpEDAR (Operational Emergency Department Attendance Register), JTTR (Joint Theatre Trauma Register) and WHIS (Whole Hospital Information System).
