## MONGOLIA COUNTRY BUSINESS PLAN: END OF YEAR REVIEW 2013/14

1. Thank you for your end of year review of the country business plan. I am very grateful for all the hard work that this represents over what has been, and continues to be, a particularly busy time.
2. I agree with your overall rating of green for the plan as a whole, and have been impressed with your excellent use of the programme budget last year. Well done.
3. Congratulations on your outstanding UKTI results in your first year of operation. Coming in the top 5 of UKTI's best performing Posts for having exceeded your targets is a significant achievement. I am conscious that this has involved a large amount of time and commitment from your small team in Ulaanbaatar and this has not gone unnoticed.
4. I am also impressed with the attention to detail given to the opening of the Visa Application Centre and the move of visa services to Manila, which seems to have gone smoothly despite initial concerns.

6. In 2014/15, I would like to see you continue to make progress against the Four Year Goals.
