Thank you for your email of 7 September 2015 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

Please provide a copy of the latest guidance issued to diplomats, or other representatives of the government travelling abroad, on the use of anti-malarial drugs. Please state the date this guidance was last reviewed.

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request.

Attached is a copy of the guidance that is published on the FCO's internal Intranet and is available to all staff. This policy is reviewed each time Public Health England (PHE) update their malaria guidelines and amended if appropriate. The last review was in July 2014 and is currently under review pending publication of the new PHE guideline in the next 2-3 weeks.

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on gov.uk in the [FOI releases](#) section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.
