2. The MAC agreed the minutes for the May meeting.

3. Tim Harrison gave an update on behalf of the secretariat. He outlined the potential uncertainty in the MAC's workplan following the results of the referendum on the UK's membership of the European Union. He also confirmed that Madeleine Sumption had been appointed as the newest member of the committee and that the interviews for the next Chair of the Committee had taken place.
4. Paul Regan updated the Committee on behalf of the Home Office. He stated that the result of the referendum meant that the following year will be a busy time for the International and Immigration Policy Group and the MAC will likely play an important role in policy development.
