<p>About this guidance</p> <p>Workflow process</p> <p>Cases already allocated to a CC case owner</p> <p>Benefits of liaison with NCA</p>	<p>This guidance tells criminal casework staff about liaising with the National Crime Agency (NCA), to help facilitate effective sharing of criminality information between government departments.</p> <p>The NCA was formed on 7 October 2013 as part of a new serious and organised crime agency. The NCA takes over the functions of the Serious Organised Crime Agency (SOCA).</p> <p>The SOCA was formed in 2006 as a result of the Serious Organised Crime and Police Act (2005) and merged with the Asset Recovery Agency in April 2008.</p> <p>The agency tackles serious organised crime including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• class A drugs• people smuggling• human trafficking• gun crime• fraud• computer crime• money laundering, and• organised immigration crime. <p>It works with other government departments in effective sharing of criminality information. <p>About this guidance</p> <p>Workflow process</p> <p>Cases already allocated to a CC case owner</p> <p>Benefits of liaison with NCA</p>	<p>This page tells you about the process followed by the criminal casework (CC) workflow team when they are contacted by the National Crime Agency (NCA).</p> <p>The process is for cases where NCA (formerly the Serious Organised Crime Agency (SOCA)) has an interest.</p> <p>Following the initial contact from NCA, you must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make a note of NCA's interest on the CID special conditions screen.• Locate the Home Office file and attach the SOCA minute sheet (ICD.4353). A new NCA minute sheet has not yet been published. Until it is, continue using the SOCA minute sheet. If the file is no longer in CC workflow, ask the relevant team to attach the SOCA minute sheet to the top right hand side of the Home Office file. <p>The NCA notification may also include information that the foreign national offender (FNO) is the subject of confiscation proceedings.</p> <p>If you have any queries about the SOCA minute sheet, contact NCA using related link: Email: NCA.</p>	<p>Related links</p> <p>Links to staff intranet removed</p>

<p>About this guidance</p> <p>Workflow process</p> <p>Cases already allocated to a CC case owner</p> <p>Benefits of liaison with NCA</p>	<p>This page tells you about the procedure to follow when a case has already been allocated to a criminal casework (CC) case owner, and the National Crime Agency (NCA) expresses an interest.</p> <p>If a case has already been allocated to a CC case owner when NCA (formerly the Serious Organised Crime Agency (SOCA)) expresses an interest in it, the case owner's details must be identified and passed to NCA so they may liaise directly with them.</p> <p>When they receive a file with the SOCA minute sheet (ICD.4353) attached (a new NCA minute sheet has not yet been published) or where one is to be attached, the CC case owner must immediately contact NCA, using related link: Email: NCA, to provide the following details:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• CC case owner details, including telephone number and email address• the full name of the foreign national offender (FNO) and their individual Home Office reference number• an update on how the case is progressing. <p>NCA must also be provided with an update in the following circumstances:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• When a decision is taken to proceed to deportation.• If a decision is made not to proceed to deportation, the CC case owner must contact NCA who may have information which could change that decision.• When the FNO is notified of the intention to deport.• When notice of an appeal against deportation is received.• When the results of the appeal are known.• When or if the FNO is granted Immigration and Asylum Chamber (IAC) bail and any restrictions.• When a deportation order is served.• As soon as removal details are known. 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	<p>particularly important as NCA have contacts in receiving countries that must be notified before the arrival of these subjects. CC must aim to give NCA at least three days notice of an impending removal.</p> <p>Where there is notification of confiscation proceedings which are a barrier to removal of the FNO from the UK, CC case owners must also refer to the barriers to deportation process instruction. <p>About this guidance</p> <p>Workflow process</p> <p>Cases already allocated to a CC case owner</p> <p>Benefits of liaison with NCA</p>	<p>This page tells you about the benefits of close liaison with the National Crime Agency (NCA).</p> <p>NCA (formerly the Serious Organised Crime Agency (SOCA)) may be able to provide support in individual criminal casework (CC) cases, and have stated they are happy to assist wherever possible.</p> <p>For example, in the course of their investigations, NCA may come across documentation that may be of use to CC in definitively establishing the identity and/or nationality of a foreign national offender (FNO).</p> <p>In instances where the Crown Court has made a confiscation order against an FNO, NCA may be able to provide assistance to CC by accessing information held on their internal database.</p> <p>For further information about the NCA, see related link: NCA external site.</p>	<p>Related links</p> <p>Links to staff intranet removed</p>
