Dear Mr. Secretary,


It was good to meet you last week and to speak on the phone. Let me confirm now my position on the points discussed.

First, I appreciate that the UK Government wants to know that EDF will remain fully committed to the project during its critical construction period. It is indeed our intention, as stated in our press release dated October 21 2015, to remain as the controlling shareholder in the Hinkley Point C company NNBG during construction. I will ask the EDF Board at our next meeting to confirm our previously stated intention not to sell down our voting rights below the majority level (>50%) and to acknowledge that any such sell down would require the consent of the UK Government during construction.

Secondly, in the light of current circumstances, I do not anticipate EDF availing of the £2b guarantee from the UK government negotiated at an earlier stage in proceedings.

Thirdly, we spoke of the potential industrial and economic advantages to the UK arising from any decision to proceed with the construction of a new nuclear twin reactor at Hinkley in Somerset. I confirm the strong expectation of EDF that UK content will achieve 64%, and our willingness to report publicly on our progress with this over the course of the project.
