Permit conditions of use and issue:

1. The fishing permit is not valid until the front of the permit is completed in full.
2. The permit remains the property of the Environment Agency and must be produced on the request of an authorised officer.
3. The availability of fishing spaces is not guaranteed and refunds are not available for non-use of the permit.
4. Children accessing the sites under the age of 14 must be continuously supervised by an adult and both adult and child must have a valid fishing permit.
5. The permit allows the use of up to two rods and lines when fishing for coarse fish and eels (where byelaws allow) and only one rod and line when fishing for other species.
6. The permit is not transferable and access is only permitted to the fishing site over authorised routes.
7. The Environment Agency reserves the right to suspend or cancel a permit, refuse entry to any site or require you to leave without notice and can refuse to grant or renew applications.
8. The permit holder enters Environment Agency property at their own risk and the Agency accepts no liability in respect of accidents, loss or injury arising out of the use of this permission.
9. Permits are issued subject to existing fishing or other rights and the normal closed seasons, the Thames Conservancy Acts and Orders (1932 –1972), Thames Navigational and General Byelaws, the Fisheries Byelaws and such other Rules, Regulations, Byelaws and orders made from time to time by the Environment Agency.
