The Merchant Shipping (Passenger Ships on Domestic Voyages) Regulations 2000

Sea Areas - Council Directive 98/18/EC

Notice to Owners, Operators and Masters

Summary

This Statutory notice sets out the sea areas around the United Kingdom as is required by Article 4.2 of Council Directive 98/18/EC of 17 March 1998 on Safety Rules and Standards for Passenger Ships

Key Points

- The notice augments S.I. 2000 No. 2687 The Merchant Shipping (Passenger Ships on Domestic Voyages) Regulations 2000.
- Although four classes of ship operation are identified in the Directive, only sea areas "C" and "D" require geographical identification.

1. The Merchant Shipping (Passenger Ships on Domestic Voyages) Regulations 2000 implements Council Directive 98/18/EC on "Safety Rules and Standards for Domestic Passenger Ships".

2. These Regulations identify four domestic passenger ship classifications as follows: Classes A, B, C and D, as in the Directive. Classes B, C and D are equivalent to Class III, Class VI, and Class VI(A) passenger vessels respectively.

3. The Annexes to this Merchant Shipping Notice set out the geographical extent of EC sea areas "C" and "D" identified as applicable in waters around the United Kingdom. These sea areas are given statutory force by way of Regulation 3(2) of the Merchant Shipping (Passenger Ships on Domestic Voyages) Regulations 2000.

4. The classification of ships Class C and Class D is based on the distance "from the line of the coast, where shipwrecked persons can land corresponding to the medium tide height", i.e. mid-point between High Water Springs and Low Water Springs, except where such plying limits are truncated by contours indicating a probability of exceeding a specified "significant wave height".

5. Specifically, the sea areas EC/C and EC/D are truncated by contours indicating a probability of exceeding a particular significant wave height of 10% over a one year period or over a specific restricted period of the year for operation exclusively in such a period.

6. The Maritime & Coastguard Agency commissioned the Marine Consultancy Service of the Meteorological Office to investigate significant

wave height in waters around the United Kingdom. The Project Report No. 422 forms the basis of this Notice. The Project Report is available from the Marine Information Centre at Spring Place (Tel: 02380 329295; Fax: 02380 329298).

7. Sea areas "EC/C" and "EC/D", are as defined, within the Directive, as follows:-

Sea Area EC/C: Sea areas where the probability of exceeding 2.5 m significant wave height is smaller than 10% over a one year period for all year round operation, or over a specific restricted period of the year for operation exclusively in such a period (e.g. summer period operation), not more than 5 miles from the line of the coast, where shipwrecked persons can land, corresponding to the medium tide height.

Sea Area EC/D: Sea areas where the probability of exceeding 1.5 m significant wave height is smaller than 10% over a one year period for all year round operation, or over a specific restricted period of the year for operation exclusively in such a period (e.g. summer period operation), not more than 3 miles from the line of the coast, where shipwrecked persons can land, corresponding to the medium tide height.

(Note - in relation to the words "where shipwrecked persons can land", it would be for the

owner or operator of the vessel to be satisfied that people could be evacuated on any of the routes to be operated on and have the appropriate procedures in place).

8. (a) The term "Sea Areas", is as defined and described in this MSN (section 7) for the purpose of the Directive 98/18/EC.

(b) The term "Port Waters", within the context of the Directive and the Merchant Shipping (Passenger Ships on Domestic Voyages) Regulations 2000, is interpreted by the United Kingdom as having the same meaning as "categorised waters". For the extent of Port Waters within the United Kingdom, reference should be made to MSN 1719 (M) - Categorisation of Waters.

(c) "Sea Areas" are found to seaward of "Port Waters (categorised waters)" and the two areas should not be confused.

9. The designations shown in Annex 1 are for all of the year, those in Annex 2 for the summer, which means the months of April to October, inclusive.

10. This Notice will come into force at the same time as Merchant Shipping (Passenger Ships on Domestic Voyages) Regulations 2000.
